Hugh Jackman to play Houdini on Broadway

HE'S the world's sexiest man and his next role will be as the world's greatest escape artist.

Hugh Jackman is set to make his return to Broadway playing Harry Houdini in a musical about the escapologist's life.

Jackman has already begun work on the show's magic routines, reports Fox News.

He is seeking advice from sleight-of-hand expert Ricky Jay, who appeared in Jackman's movie, *The Prestige*, about two feuding magicians, in 2006. The producers may also consult David Blaine and Cirque du Soleil.

Danny Elfman, once the leader of pop group Oingo Boingo and now often a composer of movie scores, is writing the music, while Kurt Andersen, a former magazine editor and radio host in New York, is said to be working on the script.

The show, set to hit the stage in 2010, would include Jackman replicating big Houdini tricks on stage.

Jackman is riding high at the moment after being named People magazine's sexiest man alive. He is currently on the publicity trail for the Baz Luhrmann epic Australia and will next be seen in X-Men Origins: Wolverine.

The movie is due next year and also stars Liev Schreiber, Ryan Reynolds and Dominic Monaghan.

Magic mourns the passing of Christian Fechner

On November 26, 2008, it was reported that magic great **Christian Fechner** has passed away at the age of 64. Christian Fechner's career started as a magician, musician, and record producer before he embarked on creating successful films, including classic titles like *Camille Claudel*.

As a performer, Fechner won the invention prize at the 1979 FISM and has devised magic effects for **David Copperfield** and **Siegfried and Roy**, and many others. Fechner's past literary projects are among the most lavish magic books ever published.

His bibliography of French conjuring books is the most complete to date, and his two-volume *Soirees Fantastiques*. He also annotated an excellent edition of **Robert-Houdin's** Memoirs published in France with numerous beautiful color illustrations of many of the treasures in his collection.

For decades, Fechner had researched the world of Robert-Houdin, through the holdings of his own extensive collection and those of French historians; public and private archives, libraries, and museums throughout Europe; and the descendants of the magician, who for the first time in a century allowed a researcher access to precious documents including the original manuscripts for the Memoirs of Robert-Houdin and other works.
