
January's Meeting

Mind Bender: 12 hours buried alive

Starting his career in entertaining at the early age of 10 years old, Mind Bender has since accomplished many milestones in his career. His highlights include performing over 10 sold out shows across the GTA, working with **Criss Angel** in Las Vegas and with **Majestik Magnificent** (Michael Jackson's personal magician) in California.

With an extreme love for pushing the limits on his escapes, **Mind Bender** is best known for his death defying acts. He has escaped from a strait-jacket while suspended upside-down, from an airtight body bag shackled and hand-cuffed, and from handcuffs strapped down to a table while swords fell down on him Russian roulette-style.

In the following link, you can watch him attempt to spend *12 hours underground* from 6:30pm to 6:30am in the cold winter, shackled in two sets of handcuffs, before he makes his big escape. (Fortunately, you don't need to watch for 12 hours – you only need 15 minutes!)

The 2022 Milbourne Christopher Award winners

(The Linking Ring)

On October 1, 2022, magicians, their families, and their friends gathered for the 30th *Milbourne Christopher Foundation Awards Presentation* to honor six deserving recipients for their contributions to the magical arts.

Milbourne Christopher was the mid-twentieth century's "*Renaissance Man*" of magic. He was the author or editor of more than twenty books on the conjuring arts, including his comprehensive *The Illustrated History of Magic*, first published in 1973 and later updated in 2006 by **Maurine Christopher**. For many award winners, Christopher's *Illustrated History*, as well as his *Panorama of Magic*, were their first introductions to magic history.

An internationally known illusionist, Christopher created and starred in the first television magic special in 1957. From 1957 to 1958 he served as the National President of the *Society of American Magicians*. He edited and contributed to numerous trade journals, and he authoritatively defined magic for reference publications. As a longtime I.B.M. member, he was a respected contributor to *The Linking Ring*. He also amassed one of the world's finest collections of magic memorabilia.

Though Milbourne Christopher passed away in 1984 at the age of seventy, nearly four decades ago, his influence continues to this day.

The *Milbourne Christopher Foundation* was established in 1989 at the behest of the late **Maurine Christopher** to perpetuate the memory of her husband, and to create annual awards that reflected his extensive career as an author, illusionist, mentalist, inventor, and tireless advocate for magic.

The 2022 *Milbourne Christopher Awards* were presented in the categories of *Illusionist, Close-up, Literary, Ambassador of Magic, Master's,* and *Lifetime Achievement*. The Awards Committee chose six recipients who distinguished themselves through their body of work and their dedication to the conjuring arts.
