January's meeting

When was the last time that you put together a new show? That experience can be daunting, but we were shown at January's meeting and can be simple and even ... fun!

Peter Mennie lead us through the process he uses to create a new show, which he does several times a year. Each of us brought a list of tricks that we could perform and some Post-It notes. That's all we needed to construct our own show.

Peter lead us through the technique he employs to build a new show – and explained the reasoning why effects belong in specific places in a show's program. Using the Post-It notes, we organized our own tricks into categories, and then selected effects from those categories to build our own show.

The result was that each person created their own show, where the flow of the program made sense and the transitions between effects were straight forward. Changing the show in the future becomes a matter of fitting other tricks from the same categories into those slots in the program.

It was a lot of fun to see your own show take shape before your eyes in a matter of minutes!



Review of Criss Angel Mindfreak Season 6

It's easy to be cynical about magicians and illusionists but even the hardest of cynics will be more than a little impressed with the illusions that sexy illusionist Criss Angel pulls off in the sixth season of his MindFreak series. Six episodes arrive on this DVD and fans of Angel's (and illusionists, in general) will find this to be a must-have for their DVD collection.



Angel makes no bones about the fact that his act is filled with illusions so there's none of the age-old hocus-pocus feel about what he does and you'll find yourself constantly trying to figure out how he did each illusion.

In the sixth season, some of Angel's illusions include him driving off a cliff at the Grand Canyon and landing in a steel cage. The car? Gone. He also likes to use innocent bystanders who may or may not be in on the trick. But when you see him make a scorpion disappear only to have it come out of a woman's mouth after he kisses her is beyond creepy. One final illusion that had my mouth hanging open in shock was the 'Grand Canyon Box Drop' where he was hung and handcuffed in the box and had to escape before the box shattered on the rocks below. Somehow, Angel did it. Truly amazing!

Extras include some inside scoop on a group of easier tricks that are on a smaller scale for Angel. There are also extra illusions that were not seen in the sixth season that originally aired on the A&E network.

Bidder finds nothing in famous magician's storage unit

A man is feeling like he's seen magic after some treasures he was hoping to get had already vanished.

Claude Yarbrough and his wife Charlotte lived on the Central Coast and performed magic around the world as 'The Pendragons'. Yesterday, the contents of their storage units in Arroyo Grande went to the highest bidder.

A Northridge man bought eleven crates for \$3,700 without being allowed to look inside them beforehand--and they turned out to be empty.

"I took a chance to bid on it, and hopefully something good is going to come up," said Ezat Darabi, who said he was prepared to spend \$5,000 on the unit.

Todd Plastino, a managing partner at Fortress-Secure Mini Storage, the storage facility, said he had been hoping for more. "A lot of these people turn around and resell the items so I was hoping there would be something good for them, but apparently most of the cases from what I've been told are empty," Plastino said.

Still, it wasn't a total loss. Darabi says the crates themselves are worth between \$500 to \$700 each, so he plans to sell them to a magician in Cincinnati.
